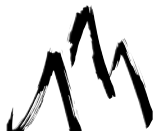

More than 85% of the furnishings and artifacts displayed are original to the family. Open 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Tues.-Sat. Admission \$6 adults, \$5 seniors, \$4 children 6-18. El Pueblo History Museum

Native American Beadworking I & II Class: Feb. 17 and 18, 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Instructor Connie Garcia of Jicarilla Apache descent will teach a beginner's class on beadworking. Participants will complete a rosette. On Feb. 26 and 27, 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., the second session of Native American Beadworking class will have participants learning how to make peyote stitch and completing a beadwork project. Tuition for each two day work shop is \$30 and supplies are \$10. Call to register.

Drawing Artifacts Workshop: Feb. 20, 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Artist Maria Westy Bush will teach a beginning drawing class for adults and students 12 years old and up. Participants begin with hands-on instruction drawing basic geometric shapes and then applying that to drawing museum artifacts. Cost is \$30 which includes supplies. Call to register.
