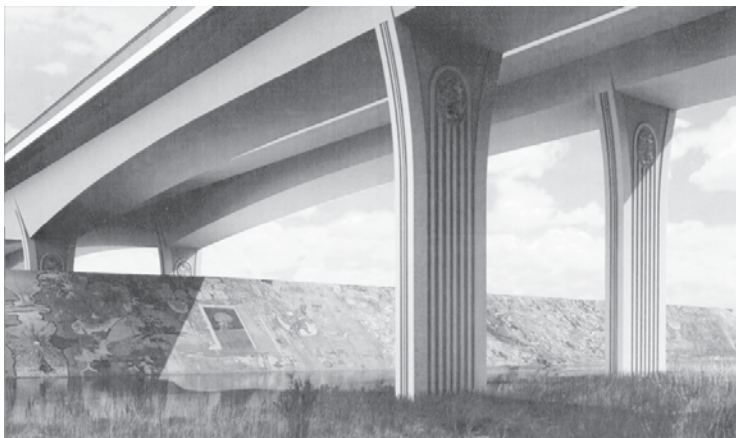


New Discount Card Production to Begin Soon
